

Peter J. Toren is an intellectual property litigator in Washington, D.C. where he helps individuals and companies protect their IP rights. He specializes in patent, trademark, copyright, and trade secret cases and has tried dozens of cases in his career. His patent representations involve diverse technologies from computer software and hardware to light emitting diodes, biotechnology to semiconductor manufacturing and fabrication, optics and medical devices to business methods. He has argued numerous times before the Second, Fifth, Ninth and Federal Circuits involving patent, copyright, and trademark law.

He was also a partner with *Sidley Austin* in New York City between 1998 and 2009. Before that, he was a federal prosecutor, including as one of the original five prosecutors with the *Computer Crime & Intellectual Property Section* (“CCIPs”) of the U.S.D.O.J. At CCIPs, where he handled a number of high-profile investigations involving violations of the Computer Fraud and Abuse Act, Criminal Copyright, Trafficking in Counterfeit Goods and the Economic Espionage Act, including one of the first cases indicted under the EEA. He also served as acting deputy chief of the section.

He is the author of the leading treatise on criminal violations of intellectual property rights and computer crime, *Intellectual Property & Computer Crime*, (Law Journal Press, updated 29 times since first published in 2003), and co-author of *Defend Trade Secrets Act of 2016 Handbook* (Wolters Kluwer). In 2014, National Law Journal named him *Top 50 Intellectual Property Trailblazers and Pioneers*.

He has published over 100 articles, including *Amending the Computer Fraud and Abuse Act*, Bloomberg BNA Electronic Commerce & Law Report, Vol. 18 No. 15, *An Analysis of Economic Espionage Act Prosecutions: What Companies Can Learn From It and What the Government Should Be Doing About It*, (BNA’s Patent, Trademark & Copyright Journal, Vol.84, No. 2081, 884, Sept. 21, 2012), and *Cyber and Internet Crime: An Overview of Procedural and Substantive Issues* (Bloomberg BNA, 2014). He won the *2010 Burton Award for Excellence in Legal Writing* for his article, *The Intersection of Intellectual Property and Bankruptcy Law*. He has also spoken many times on a variety of legal topics. He is a frequent contributor to the press and has recently appeared in *The Wall Street Journal*, *New York Times*, *Forbes*, *CNN*, *Bloomberg TV*, and the *Guardian*.
